who benefits from palliative care?

Those with a serious illness affecting their quality of life or causing them significant discomfort.

Helps with Discontinuation of Curative Treatment

Continues to provide support, education, and symptom management when patient decides to focus on comfort care.

What can my patients expect from palliative care?

- Relief from distressing symptoms such as pain, shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite, difficulty sleeping
- Improved ability to carry on with their life
- Improved ability to tolerate medical treatment
- Better understanding of their medical condition and medical choices

Is Palliative Care the same as hospice care?

No, hospice care is meant specifically for those approaching the last stages of life. Palliative care is appropriate for all stages of a serious illness.
