

CASE MANAGER

MAIN PURPOSE: FLSA Status: Salaried

Exempt

Provides coordination of care to ensure the continuous assessment of each patient's and family's needs that are identified, met, and implemented as outlined in the interdisciplinary plan of care.

REPORTING RELATIONSHIP:

Reports to the Patient Care Coordinator and is accountable to the Assistant Director of Nursing or the Director of Nursing.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Patient Care:

- Performs an initial and ongoing comprehensive assessment of the patient's and family's physical, psychosocial, environmental, safety and spiritual needs within 5 days of the election of hospice services, with reassessments no less frequently than every 15 days.
- Develops an individualized plan of care based on a comprehensive assessment in conjunction with the patient's and family's goals.
- Assesses all aspects of the patient's pain and comfort, developing and implementing an individualized pain management plan.
- Provides holistic, patient/family-centered care as prescribed, in the patient's residence to improve the quality of life.
- Consults and collaborates with the interdisciplinary team and other agencies involved in the patient's care.
- Supports the patient, family, and caregiver in medical decision making and unique spiritual and cultural beliefs.
- Provides supervision of LPN and Home Health/Hospice Aides in accordance with Agency policy and regulatory requirements.
- Performs admissions as assigned.
- Completes an average of 25 visits per week
- Communicates appropriate information and participates at IDG meeting.

Documentation:

- Documents problems, nursing assessments, appropriate goals, care provided, care interventions, patient/family teaching, and patient and family outcomes.
- Completes patient assessment documentation on the day care is given.
- Documents all physician orders, IDG notes, and patient notes on the day work is performed.
- Documents LPN, Home Health, and Hospice Aide supervisory visits every 14 days.
- Helps to provide continuity of care between team members and other service providers by ensuring verbal and written reports are clear, concise, and timely.

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ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS (continued):

Teaching:

- Teaches patient self-care.
- Teaches those parts of patient care appropriate for each family, or ECF staff to provide.
- Teaches indications, side effects, and contraindications of all medications.
- Assists the patient's family, or ECF staff, with understanding the illness, the dying process, plan of care, and needs of the patient.
- Teaches the patient and family their rights regarding hospice care and benefits.
- Serves as preceptor to other staff nurses, Aides, and students.

ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONS:

- Committed to Agency resolution against fraud and abuse.
- Knowledgeable in hospice philosophy, LCD's, and state and federal rules and regulations.
- Arrives to work and meetings on time and ready to work.
- Respects confidentiality of patients/families and other Agency employees.
- Attends monthly nurses meeting and educational meetings/conferences for professional growth as required.
- Attends and completes yearly nursing skills validations.
- Participates in agency infection control plan.
- Sees change as an opportunity and maintains a level of flexibility, which allows for adaptation to new ways of performing.
- Follows directions and policies that allow for an organizational commitment to working under time pressures without sacrificing quality.
- Performs other duties that may be assigned.

JOB REQUIREMENTS:

- Possesses the ability to perform the following tasks for varying periods of time: standing, walking, sitting, lifting objects up to 75 lbs., pushing/pulling objects up to 200 lbs., climbing stairs, stooping, kneeling, twisting, bending, reaching overhead and in front of body, simultaneous use of both hands, wrists, and fingers.
- Possesses the ability to perform the following tasks for varying periods of time: speak in conversational tones utilizing the English/American Language, hear conversations as well as bodily function sounds with various medical or non-medical devices, observe patients via touch sensitivity that is strong enough to palpate various areas on the human body and allow an accurate reporting of a pulse, see with vision acuity: near, 20 inches or less, and far, 20 inches or more, with or without corrective devices such as glasses or contacts, have a depth perception of three dimensions, and a sharpness of vision/focus with adequate peripheral vision to allow an acute awareness of surroundings.

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JOB REQUIREMENTS (continued):

Possesses the ability to work in a variety of environmental conditions that include, but are not limited to the following: adverse weather conditions, dust, fumes, tobacco smoke, noise, closed-in spaces or rooms, and locations with poor or improper lighting and glare.

- May be required to work in shifts that may be steady or rotating.
- On call shifts are required
- Possesses the ability to operate and drive an automobile and maintains a valid driver's license and current automobile insurance. Requires use of personal vehicle.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Maintains current R.N. nursing licensure in Indiana and CPR certification.
- Previous nursing experience required with home health/hospice experience preferred.
