









Progress Toward \$10,000,000 Goal thru 12/31/2019




Fundraising Last 10 Years

2019 Census Facts

- -- Total referrals increased 1.02% (24 referrals)
- -- Palliative Care admissions (under home health license) increased 59% from 2018
- -- Conversion rate increased to 71.86% from 71.79%
- -- DBA's increased to 8.03% from 7.64%
- -- Percentage of patients refusing admission decreased to 3.08% from 4.05%

2019 Census Facts

- -- Hospital referrals jumped to 46.5% of all referrals from 44.6% in 2017. Hospital referrals have of a median length of stay if less than half of all referrals.
- -- ALOS for admitted Physician referrals increased from 77 days to 88 days
- Median LOS for admitted Physician referrals increased from 26 days to 37 days
- -- Percentage of family/self referral conversion rate increased to 68.80% from 67.82% lasts year

Growth Since the Beginning...

Since 01/01/80 through 12/31/19, on an annually added basis, CHC has cared for 39,078 patients.

42% of all the patients served by CHC over the course of 39 years have been seen in just the last eight years alone.

Over 25%

of all the patients served by CHC in its 39 year history have been served in just the last FIVE years alone.

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

Bereavement Services 2019

- Of the total bereaved clients served (2,987), 24% are community, 69% are hospice and 7% are DBA (Died Before Admission)/Other (bereaved of patients who discharged alive and then died).
- The Bereavement Department is averaging 139 deaths per month (including DBA/Other deaths).
- Of the total individual/family counseling sessions (4,582) 1% were sessions with DBA/Other clients, 35% were with hospice clients and 64% were sessions with community clients.

Volunteer Services 2019

- CHC has hundreds volunteers in a wide variety of service.
- Medicare requires Volunteers participating in direct patient care and hospice programming.
- This must be recorded, a dollar amount applied, and reported to Medicare as a savings to the hospice on an annual basis.

Volunteer Services 2019

- During 2019, CHC Hospice Program volunteers worked 15,711. This is equivalent to 7.5 FTEs who never call in sick or take vacations.
- These volunteers drove 46,281 miles. This is like driving around the world nearly two times.
- Volunteers in this capacity provided dollar savings to CHC during 2019 totaling \$418,498, up 3% from 2018.

2019 Accomplishments

 On Press Ganey surveys during 2019 the question, "Generally speaking, did you have a positive experience with Center for Hospice Care" generated a "Yes" response 97% of the time. "Would you recommend Center for Hospice Care to others," generated a "Yes" response 97% of the time. There were 971 responses to these two questions as of 11/30/19.
