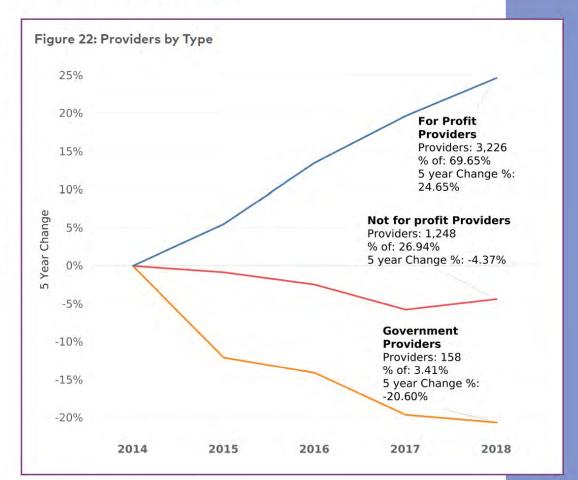
Updates

 Through June 2020 CHC has recognized \$12,181,437 of per diem gross revenue. If the 2021 rates had been in place January 1, we would have recognized an additional \$610,830. Annualized that would be \$1,221,660 of additional revenue. Based on the new rates, CHC should see approximately \$305,000 of additional per diem gross revenue in 2020 Q4.

Who Provides Care? (continued)

Tax Status

As shown in figure 22, 69.7% of active Medicare provider numbers were assigned to hospice providers with forprofit tax status and 26.9% with not-for-profit status. For-profit hospice providers grew by 24.7 % since 2014 while non-profit hospice providers retracted 4.4%. Government-owned hospice providers comprised only 3.4% and has also declined by more than 20% since 2014.

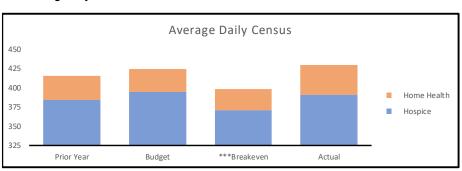

Post-Campaign Fundraising Initiatives

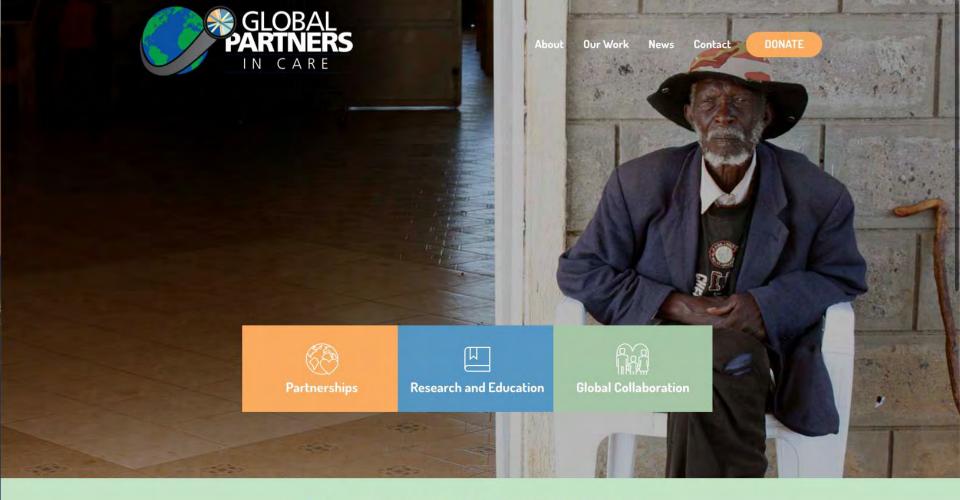
- 1. <u>Expand unrestricted giving</u> through existing annual giving programs while identifying and evaluating new programs to bolster this area.
